
OUR BADGE

Peter is District Scoutmaster in Box Hill and has been Scoutmaster with 1st Camberwell North and 16th Box Hill, and now provides a large portion of the driving force behind the Scout Section in Box Hill. Peter is actively engaged with stage settings for the Melbourne Gang Show, and in our Show he has assisted with the production and setting of the musical items.

Rick, at the moment, is engaged in Rover Squire training with 16th Box Hill, where he has been through all other sections. Having been a member of the cast last year, Rick now has the additional task of assisting Rod and Peter with the musical production of the Show.

When it was suggested that I write a few lines for this programme the theme

was to be some highlights in the history of Scouting in Box Hill.

There have been many achievements since the Movement first commenced in Box Hill over forty-five years ago. At that time it would have been difficult to imagine that there would ever be one thousand boys in the game of Scouting in this City. But such is the case today.

Another achievement is the very great improvement in the Scouting standards of today. Even as recently as ten years ago the award of a Queen's Scout Badge was a comparatively rare event. Today it can confidently be expected than ten to fifteen Scouts will gain this coverted award each year. But to me these events are not highlights, but milestones. It is the same Spirit—on the part of boy and adult alike—that has enabled this Showtime to be presented. It is the real reason why before the curtain even rises the Show has been a success and as the last curtain falls you will know why



It must have been said 72,000 times in the last six months. For that is how long it has taken to plan and produce Whitehorse Showtime '66. The cast have had a total of 44 hours rehearsal to present three hours of entertainment for you tonight. There are 75 members in the cast, each of whom appear in an average of seven items to fill the 524 parts in the show. There are 58 speaking parts

in the eight sketches and 466 singing parts in the 14 musical items. So everyone connected with the show is very busy with each boy appearing in a wide variety of character parts as everything from an overgrown fairy to a choirboy.

We are convinced that participation in a show of this kind provides invaluable experience for the boys, not only from the confidence they gain in facing 1400 critical spectators (yourself included) but also from the comradeship and teamspirit that necessarily develops within the cast.

This was the sole aim in mind when Whitehorse Showtime was first considered and it is certainly to the credit of the District Association, who provide the finance for the production without asking for big returns, for they are equally convinced that the show helps the boys.

So we present Whitehorse Showtime '66 for your enjoyment and we trust you will agree with our title cry and say "It's been alright tonight".
